WHAT IS THE ADVERSE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES STUDY (ACE)?

The ACE Study is one of the largest investigations ever conducted to assess associations between childhood maltreatment and later-life health and wellbeing.

WHAT WILL YOU LEARN?

The relationship between the ACE Study and failure in school, inability to manage behaviors, homelessness, poverty, food insecurity, incarceration, and addiction.

How a person's history of adverse childhood experiences can lead to chronic disease, including mental illness, and learning difficulties.

Resilience as a positive adaptation within the context of significant adversity.
