

On Monday, August 1, 2022, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) released the Continuum of Care (CoC) Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO). The Pikes Peak Continuum of Care (PPCoC) is the El Paso County/Colorado Springs Collaborative Applicant for CO-504 represented by Community Health Partnership.
