### PPCoC 3-Year Strategic Plan - Goals

Make homelessness rare by reducing the inflows of people who experience homelessness into the region.

Make homelessness brief by reducing the duration of time people spend in temporary shelter or unsheltered. Make homelessness
nonrecurring and onetime by improving system
outcomes to permanent
housing solutions.







#### Rare

- Decrease the number of homeless people who are experiencing unsheltered homelessness,
- Increase community bed utilization of transitional housing beds,
- Reduce first time homelessness, and,
- Address racial disparities by reducing first time homelessness among black, indigenous, and persons of color (BIPOC).

### Brief

- Reduce length of time people experience homelessness in emergency shelter,
- Reduce length of time prior to housing move-in,
- Increase exits of unsheltered people to permanent housing by street outreach, and,
- Increase exits of unsheltered people to safe, temporary shelter by street outreach.

### One-time

- Decrease returns to homelessness from emergency shelter,
- Increase employment for people who exit homeless programs,
- Increase public benefits for people who exit homeless programs,
- Increase the overall successful placement of homeless people into permanent housing, and,
- Increase retention of permanent housing solutions.

**Goal 1:** Make homelessness rare by reducing the inflows of people who experience homelessness into the region.

Objective 1.1: Decrease the unsheltered homeless count for the Point in Time by 10%.

Objective 1.2: Achieve bed utilization for transitional housing at 90% or greater.

Objective 1.3: Achieve a 15% reduction in First Time homelessness.

Objective 1.4: Reduce first time homelessness for black, indigenous, and people of color (BIPOC) by 25%.

**Goal 2:** Make homelessness brief by reducing the duration of time people spend in temporary shelter or unsheltered.

Objective 2.1: Reduce length of time persons are active in ES programs to fewer than **60-days**.

Objective 2.2: Reduce length of time prior to housing move-in to fewer than 120 median days.

Objective 2.3: Increase exits to permanent housing from street outreach by 5%.

Objective 2.4: Increase exits into temporary/Institutions from street outreach by 10%.

**Goal 3:** Make homelessness **nonrecurring** and one-time by improving system outcomes to permanent housing solutions.

Objective 3.1: Decrease homeless returns to fewer than **20%** within six-months of stays from emergency shelter.

Objective 3.2: Increase cash earned benefits for system leavers to more than 20% for all leavers.

Objective 3.3: Increase non-cash benefits for system leavers to more than 40% for all leavers.

Objective 3.4: Increase successful exit placements into permanent housing to 20% of all exits.

Objective 3.5: Achieve retention of permanent housing at **90%** or greater.

# **Goal 1:** Make homelessness rare by reducing the inflows of people who experience homelessness into the region.

- CARES Act Funding Leveraged public funding for homelessness

- Homeless Prevention Increased funding for prevention
  - Catholic Charities of Central Colorado, Family Promise of Colorado Springs
- Homeless Diversion Increase funding and training on Diversion
  - Community Health Partnership, National Alliance to End Homelessness
- Transitional Housing Increased utilization of TH beds
  - Partners in Housing, Ithaka, Homeward Pikes Peak, TESSA, Kingdom Builders Family Life Centers, Hayesa Red Wind, Family Life Services, Dream Centers
- Poverty Providers Addressing income inequities to reduce inflow
  - Westside Cares, Tri-Lakes Cares, Catholic Charities of Central Colorado



# **Goal 2:** Make homelessness brief by reducing the duration of time people spend in temporary shelter or unsheltered.

- Coordinated Entry Expand and improve CE system work
  - Community Health Partnership, PPCoC Coordinated Entry Advisory Committee, Rocky Mountain Human Services
- Emergency Shelters Increase utilization of shelter beds
  - Salvation Army, Springs Rescue Mission, The Place
- **Street Outreach** Reduce and support unsheltered homelessness
  - The Place, Homeward Pikes Peak, Colorado Springs Fire and Police Departments, Rocky Mountain Human Services, Veterans Affairs, PPCoC Street Outreach Committee
- Emergency Housing Vouchers Focus on literal homeless households
  - Colorado Springs Housing Authority, Homeward Pikes Peak, Springs Rescue Mission, Community Health Partnership, Colorado Department of Local Affairs
- Landlord Engagement Increase landlord connections, Housing Navigators
  - Apartment Association of Southern Colorado, Partners in Housing, Community Health Partnership, Westside Cares, Springs Rescue Mission, Homeward Pikes Peak, Pikes Peak Veteran Housing Fund



# **Goal 3:** Make homelessness nonrecurring and one-time by improving system outcomes to permanent housing solutions.

- Permanent Supportive Housing Permanent housing retention
  - The Place, Homeward Pikes Peak, Veterans Affairs, Volunteers of America, Springs Rescue Mission
- **Veteran Services** Connections to support for military veterans
  - Mount Carmel Veteran Services Center, Volunteers of America, Veterans Affairs, Rocky Mountain Human Services, Homefront Military Network
- Homeless Management Information System Data and reporting
  - Community Health Partnership, Colorado Statewide HMIS Collaborative
- Public Benefits Leveraging available health and income benefits
  - El Paso County Department of Human Services, Colorado Community Health Alliance
- Leveraging Healthcare Connections to health services in housing
  - Peak Vista Community Health Centers, Catholic Charities of Central Colorado, Colorado Springs Fire Department



#### Community Gaps – Areas of Growth

- Family Homelessness lack of dedicated permanent housing
- \$ for supportive services voucher funds but little for services
- **Discharge planning coordination** hospital/community corrections
- Affordable housing stock few units accept vouchers
- **Rent price increases** increased risk of homelessness
- **Homeless Diversion** problem solving/flexible financial assistance
- Fund best practices alignment between funders
- Coordination with public benefits Medicaid/DHS
- Focus on vulnerable subpopulations BIPOC, LGTBQIA+
- Voices of people experiencing homelessness advisory council
