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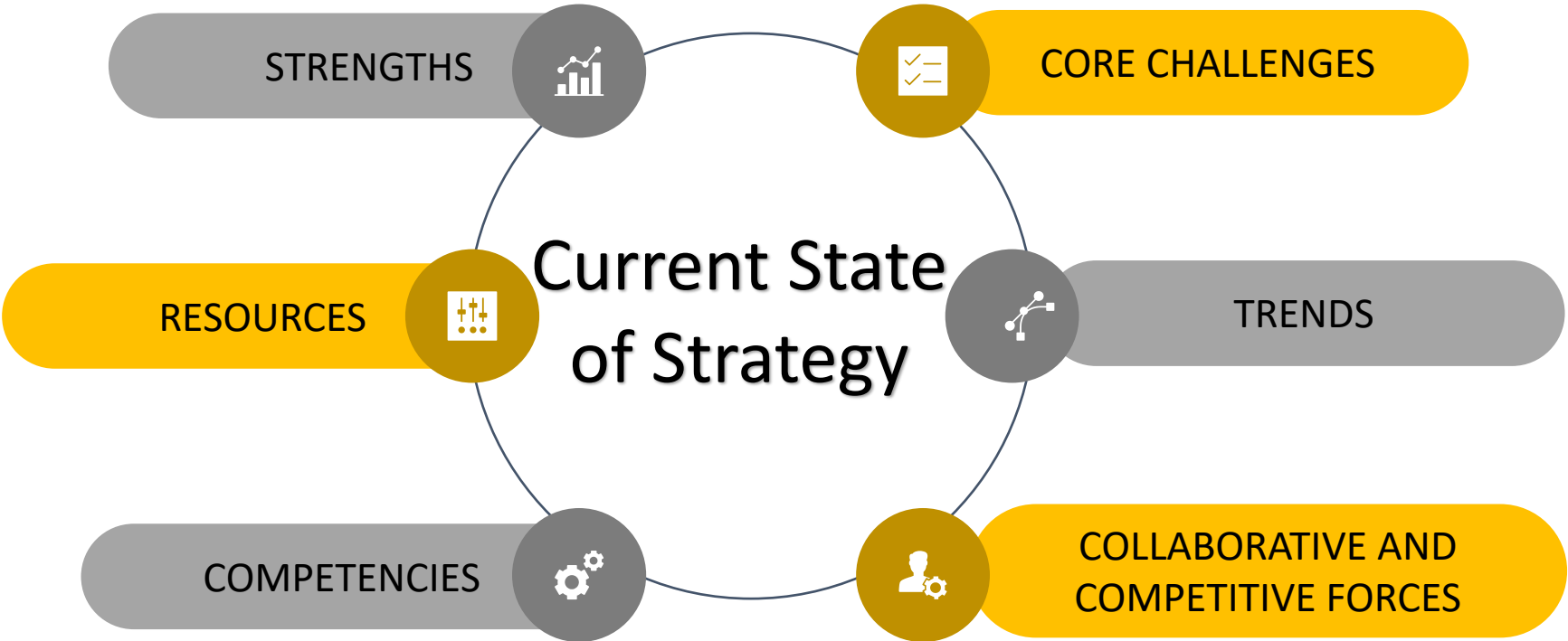

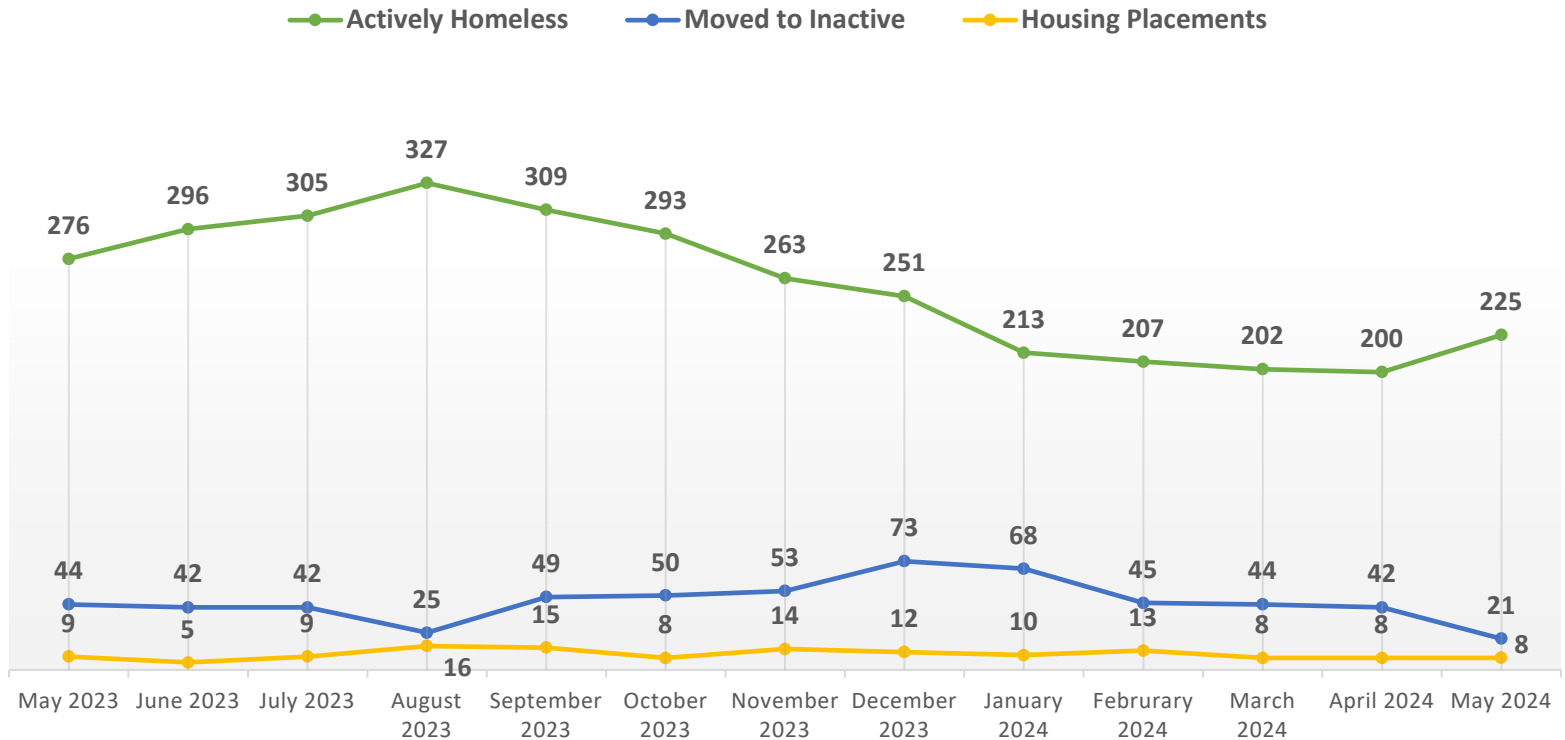

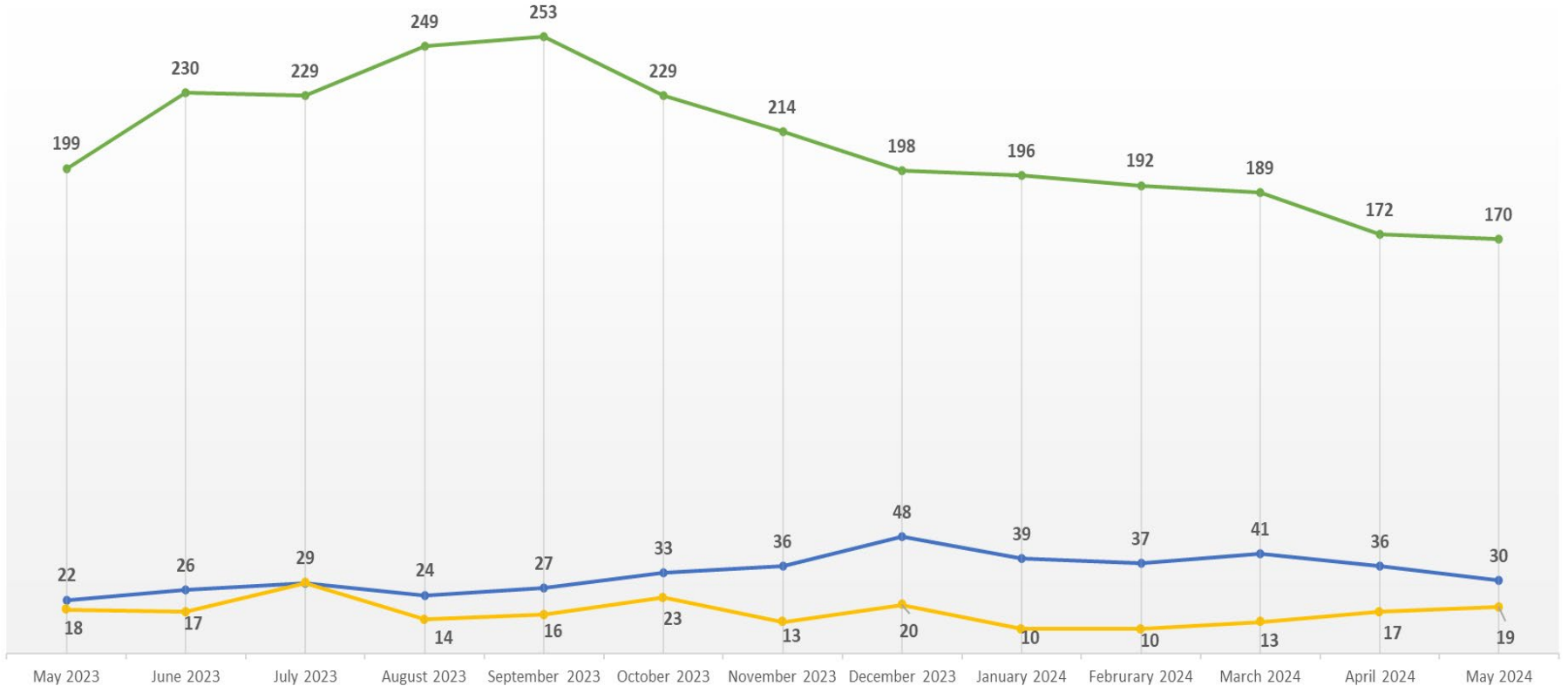

PPCoC Strategic Plan - Goals

Make homelessness **rare** by reducing the inflows of people who experience homelessness into the region.



Make homelessness **brief** by reducing the duration of time people spend in temporary shelter or unsheltered.

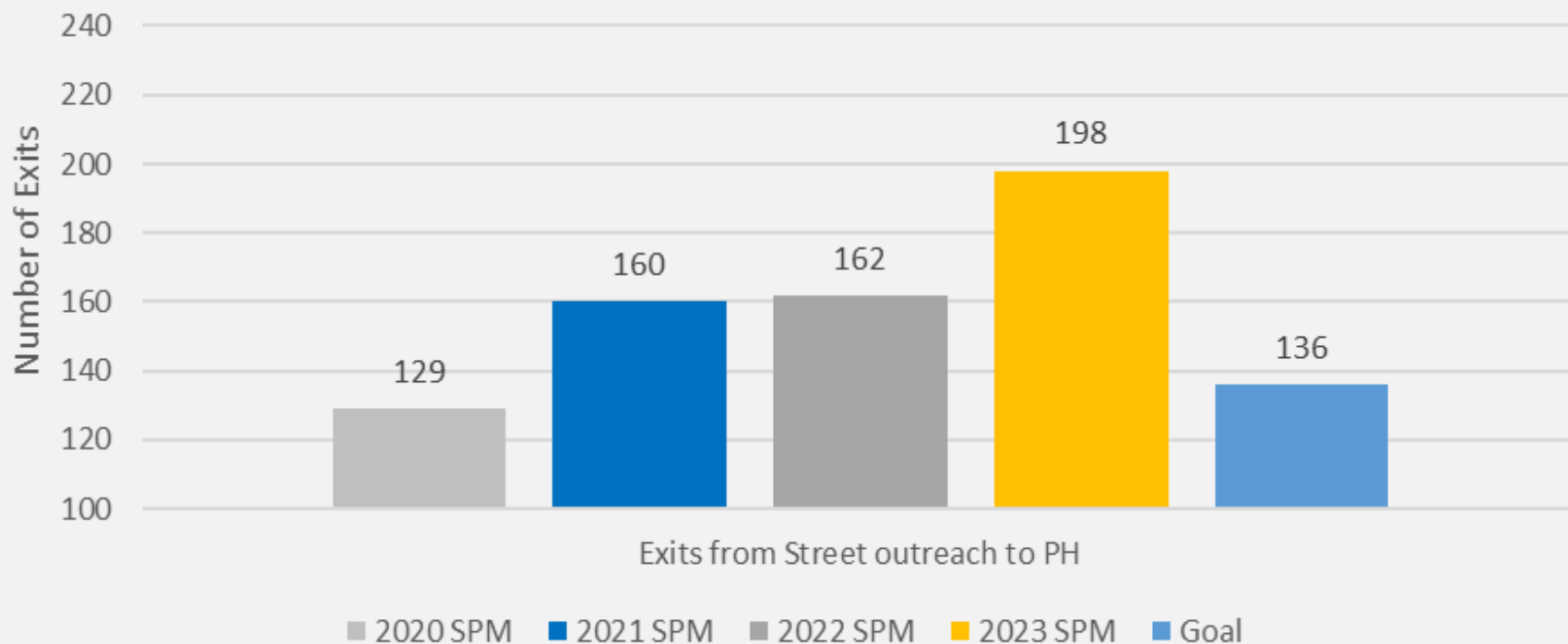


Make homelessness **nonrecurring** and one-time by improving system outcomes to permanent housing solutions.



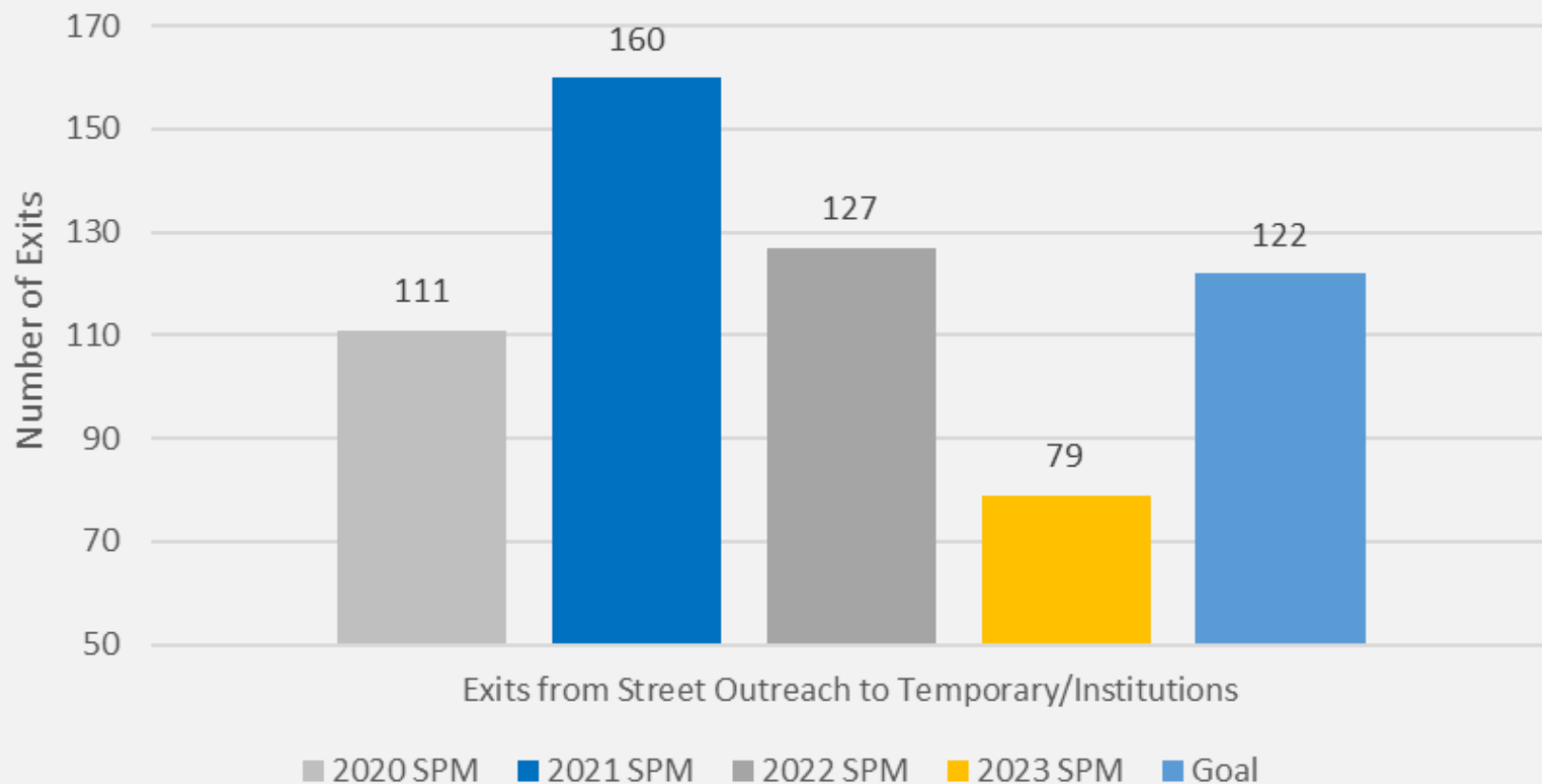
MAKE HOMELESSNESS BRIEF by reducing the duration of time people spend in temporary shelter or unsheltered.

Objective 2.3: Increase exits to permanent housing from street outreach by 5%.



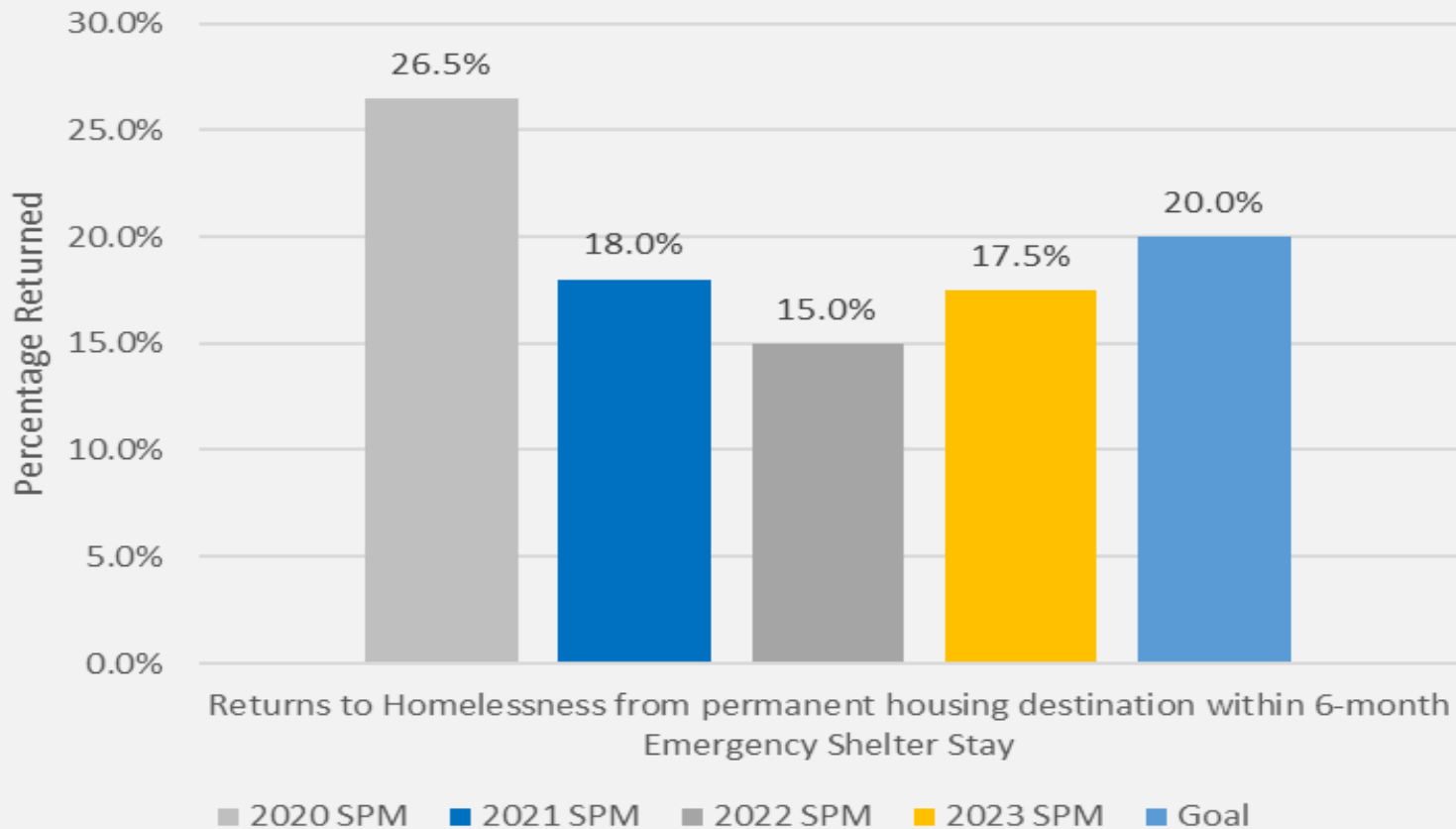
MAKE HOMELESSNESS BRIEF by reducing the duration of time people spend in temporary shelter or unsheltered.

Objective 2.4: Increase exits into temporary/Institutions from street outreach by **10%**.



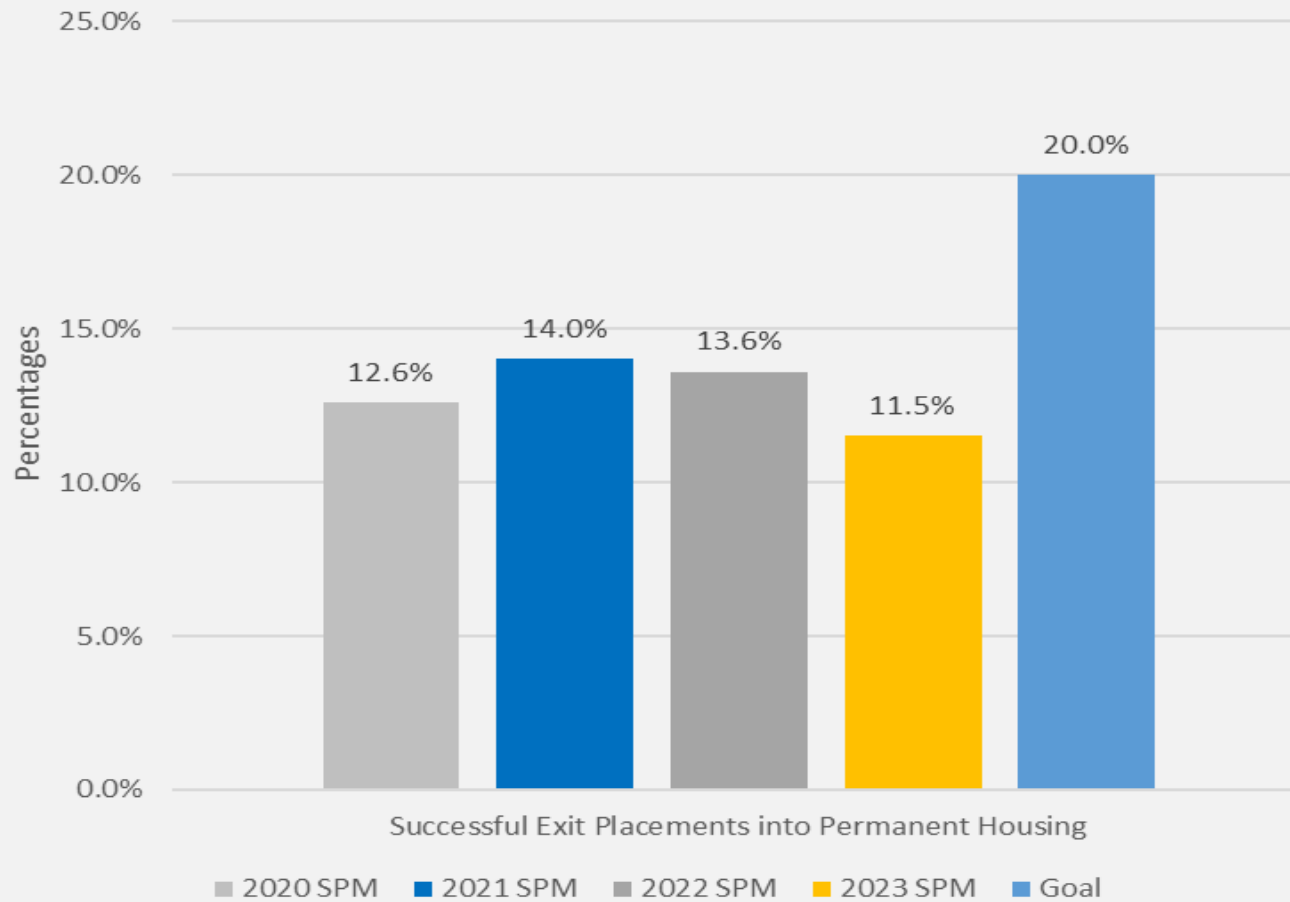
MAKE HOMELESSNESS NONRECURRING by improving system outcomes to permanent housing solutions.

Objective 3.1: Decrease homeless returns to less than **20%** within six-months of stays from emergency shelter.



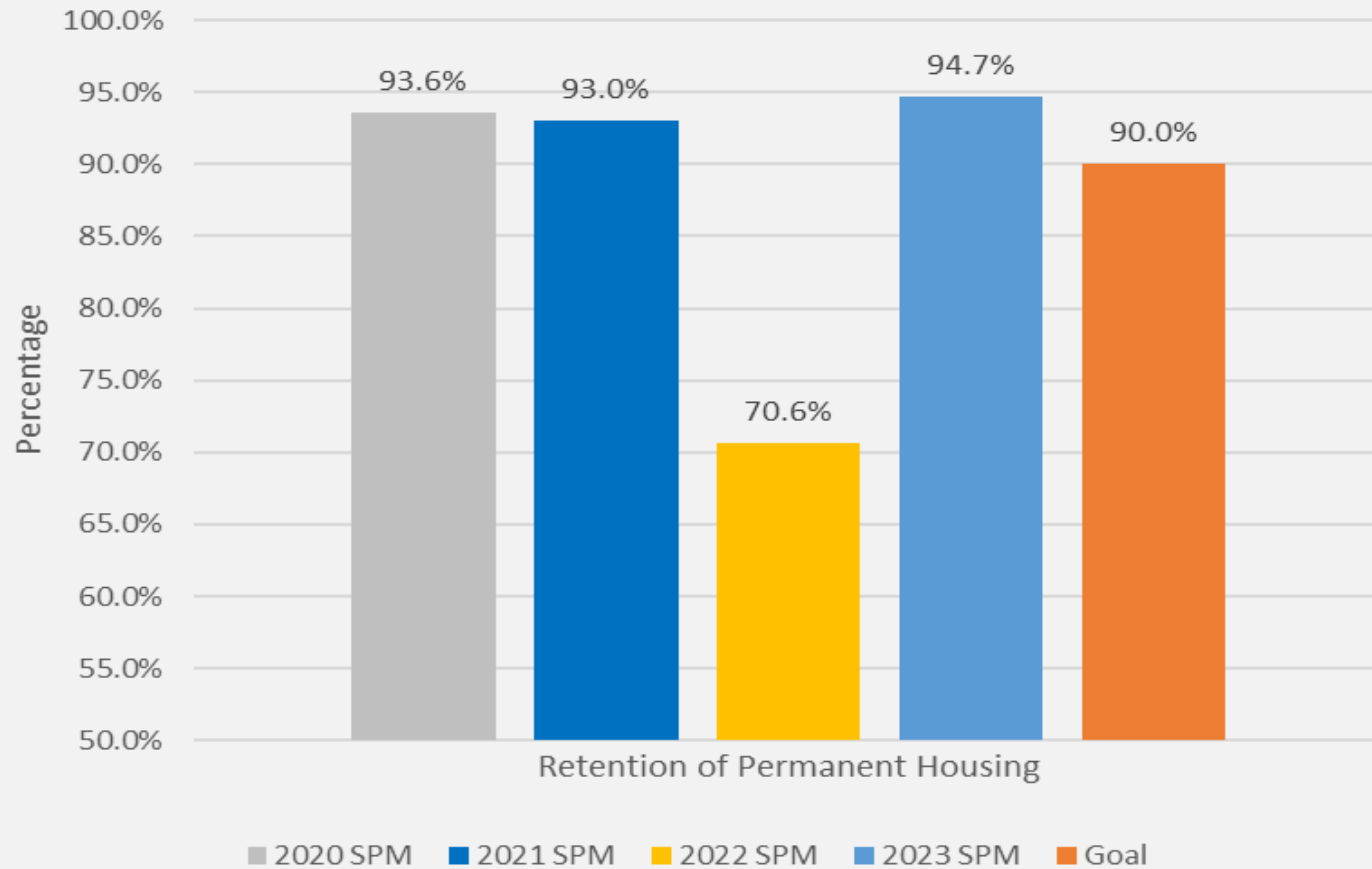
MAKE HOMELESSNESS NONRECURRING by improving system outcomes to permanent housing solutions.

Objective 3.4: Increase successful exit placements into permanent housing by **20%** of all exits.

Objective 3.5: Increase retention of permanent housing to **90%** or greater.

21% of people experiencing homelessness in the U.S. live with a SMI

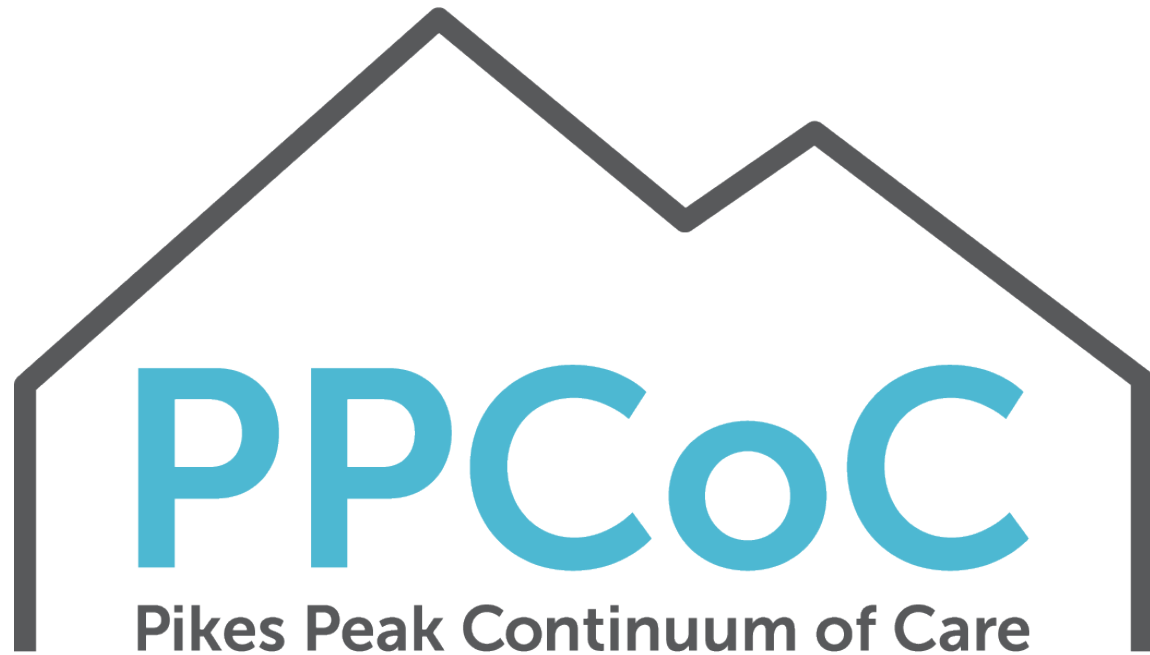
22% of people experiencing homelessness in El Paso County live with a SMI
